

Transformer for sale at Tjeldbergodden April 2019





Background

- Statnett established the reserve power plant at Tjeldbergodden in 2008 in response to an energy deficit in the region
- In 2016 the new transmission line Ørskog-Sogndal was finalized, and the need for reserve power was no longer present
- The power plant is being decomissioned and has been sold
- The transformer is still for sale and will be available August 2019.
- Statnett has an identical transformer at the Nyhamna power plant as well




Step up transformer 11,5/132 kV 160 MVA

- Year of fabrication: 2007, operational 2008
- The transformer has run less than 400 hours since 2008
- Delivery: the transformer will be delivered preserved at Port of Tjeldbergodden, FAS incoterms 2015.
- Statnett is open to receive offers to buy from buyers with track record and financing capability
- Included in the sale at cost coverage:
 - 7 x Siemens Switch gear: Type 8DA Extendable Fixed-Mounted Circuit-Breaker Switchgear up to 40.5 kV, Single Busbar, Single-Pole Metal-Enclosed, Metal-Clad, Gas-Insulated
 - 7 x 11.5 kV PEX cables
 - 21x 12 kV Coils (1300A)
